<u>Ultra Grand Prix</u>

From Bill Dodson: Our new year starts off with the Jed Smith 50K on February 6 - we have 53 entrants so far. Next will be Way Too Cool 50K on March 5 - it is by lottery which has already been held with 1000 chosen entrants plus there is a wait list. It has become the most sought after 50K in the US.

The American River 50M on April 2 has 462 entrants so far.

We have a Facebook Group, 'PA Ultra GP' which has 263 members. I use it regularly to keep members informed of Registration opening and closing, price increases and slots remaining as races get close to filling. I monitor it pretty carefully to avoid inappropriate postings and requests for membership. Others occasionally use it for posting relevant information and asking questions.

Gary Wang will no longer be doing our standings. Jason Reed has indicated an interest in helping Tom and/or others expand the Road and XC programs to include MUT.

Race Walking Committee

The 2016 Pacific Association Race Walking Schedule is coming together. Competitions for the 2016 Pacific Association Grand Prix will include:

- 1-mile (January 23 at Cal-Berkeley at the beginning of their All Comers Meet)
- 1-hour (March 6 at College of Marin in Kentfield)
- 3,000-meter (May 22 tentative date at Mount Diablo High School in Concord)
- 5,000-meter (June 19, in association with the Western Region Track and Field Club Championships at the College of San Mateo)*
- 10-kilometer (September 11 at William B. Pond Park in Carmichael/Sacramento)
- 20-kilometer (October 23 or 30, also at William B. Pond Park in Carmichael/Sacramento).

*Please note that the Race Walking Committee currently does not plan to have Judges available for the Pacific Association Open Track and Field Championships or for the Pacific Association Masters Championships. In several previous years, we had held the 5,000-meter Grand Prix with the Open Championships.

We do plan on having Judges at the following other meets:

- April 16 (Saturday), during the Shor/Sheppard Classic Youth meet, San Jose, with 1,500-meter and 3,000-meter distances
- May 29 (Sunday), during the Bay Area Senior Games, College of San Mateo, with 1,500 meter distance and possibly other distances, if requested
- June 11 (Saturday), during the Pacific Association Youth Championships, location to be determined
- June 24-26 (Friday-Sunday), during the USATF National Junior Outdoor Championships, Clovis, California some of our Pacific Association Judges will be at this meet
- June 25 (Saturday), Region 16 Junior Olympic Track & Field Championships, Sacramento
- July 25 (Monday) and July 26 (Tuesday) following last year's schedule for the National Junior Olympics, this year in Sacramento.

At the USATF annual meeting in Houston, the IAAF rule about a "Pit Lane" or penalty box was added to the USATF rules. In the rules of race walking, athletes are normally disgualified when they receive red cards from three different judges [indicating that they have either lost contact (both feet off the ground) or have a bent knee when the forward leg strikes the ground and through the vertical position]. The Pit Lane will be used in certain USATF races in which Youth may qualify for international competitions. Its first implementation in a road race in the United States will be at the World Race Walking Team Selection Races in April in Missouri, and its first implementation in a track race in the United States will be this June at the National Junior Outdoor Championships in Clovis, California, where many Pacific Association officials will be working. The Pit Lane will require many more volunteers (two runners for each of the five judges) and extra officials (to run the Pit Lane). In the 10,000-meter races, an athlete who receives red cards from three different judges will be sent to the Pit Lane (a 10-meter-long area in lanes 5, 6, and 7, starting about 80 meters before the finish line) for 120 seconds, after which they rejoin the race. In a race using the Pit Lane, athletes who get a red card from a fourth judge are disgualified. If the third red card doesn't get to the Chief Judge (or Assistant Chief Judge) before the athlete finishes the race, the 120-second penalty time is added to the finishing time. The penalty is 60 seconds for races up to and including 5,000 meters. As far as we understand, the Pit Lane will not be implemented in the National Junior Olympics in Sacramento.

Only one new Apprentice Judge was trained at the clinic in Sacramento on January 9. Hopefully more will be trained on January 31 in San Mateo at Serra HS.

<u>2015 Cross Country</u>: The 2015 Youth Cross Country season was highly successful with increased athlete participation at both club hosted and championship meets. There were 488 total entries in USATF Pacific Association Cross Country Championships.

The 2015 PA Youth Cross Country Grand Prix had the desired effect of encouraging more athletes to compete in club-hosted meets. All club hosted meets saw an increase in participation over 2014 with more than 100 athletes participating in all meets and two meets with over 200 athletes.

<u>2016 Track and Field</u>: The Youth Track and Field season will commence in March. The season will begin with 16 club hosted meets and culminate with the Pacific Association Championships, the Region 16 Junior Olympic Championships, and then the National Junior Olympic Championships. The Region 16 and National Junior Olympics will be held at Sacramento State University.
