OFFICIALS ANNUAL MEETING AND AWARDS

As we are close out the 2022 Track and Field Season, it is important to remember and recognize those individuals who have been outstanding, shown leadership and have been most effective in their respective areas. These outstanding officials were recognized and honored at the Annual Meeting at the end of August. The AWARDS COMMITTEE actively solicited nominations for awards during the course of the Track and Field season. The committee comprised of Awards Committee Chair Leon Glover, Officials Chair Phil Leake and Certification Chair Ajay Padgaonkar handed out the Association's Major Officials Awards, National Officials Certificates, Association Certificates and Apprentice Awards. Also handed out were Chair's Awards for those officials who were exceptional in assisting the operation of PA activities.

The Major Officials Awards are:

The Officials Committee of the PA/USATF recognizes outstanding members—and friends of track and field—with five (5) major awards, normally presented at the officials' annual meeting. Along with the National USATF Officials Awardees, the year-by-year Pacific Association Officials Awardees are listed below.

The Dick Connors Meritorious Service Award: Recipient must have ten (10) years' experience as a Track & Field Official AND must be certified as Masters level official with the USATF. This award is not required to be awarded every year.

George Newlon Special Recognition Award: Recipient should normally have seven (7) years' experience as a Track & Field Official AND be certified as either National or Master level official with the USATF. This award is primarily for achievement in the area of Track event officiating. This award is not required to be awarded every year.

Dick Barbour Special Recognition Award: Recipient should normally have seven (7) years' experience as a Track & Field Official AND be certified as either National or Master level official with the USATF. This award is primarily for achievement in the area of Field event officiating. This award is not required to be awarded every year.

Horace Crow Special Recognition Award: Recipient should normally have seven (7) years' experience as a Track & Field Official AND be certified as either National or Master level official with the USATF. This award is primarily for achievement in the area of Field event officiating. This award is not required to be awarded every year.

Lori and Sonny Maynard Special Recognition Award: Recipient must be a person involved, other than as a spectator, in Track & Field, LDR, or Race Walking in any capacity AND has exhibited exceptional dedication to the sport of Track & Field, LDR or Race Walking. This award is not required to be awarded every year.

In addition, The National Officials Committee, upon recommendation from the Pacific Association Officials Committee, confers National Officials Certificates to those officials, association, national or master who are deemed to be outstanding officials for the year. Our own Official's Committee honored a large number of officials not recognized by the NOC. Apprentices who also did exceptionally well this season were recognized.

Submit Your NCAA Resume Form By September 30

NOTE: When you register and apply, REMEMBER TO APPLY FOR THE WEST REGIONAL!

REMINDER: Register on the NCAA RefQuest Platform

Milan Donley, the NCAA Track and Field National Assignor of Officials, announced on July 18 that the new NCAA RefQuest registration was open. You must be registered on this online platform in order to apply to be selected to work Division 1, Division 2, or Division 3 NCAA Championships in Cross Country, Indoor Track and Field, or Outdoor Track and Field.

Follow this link to register. Click "Register" in the upper right corner. The registration closes

September 30, 2022. Follow this link to view the host locations for the D-1, D-2, and D-3 Championships for Cross Country, Indoor, and Outdoor Championships.

RQ+ is the new company providing online registration, education, assigning, and payment services to officials for selected NCAA championship events across several sports, including track and field. RQ+ replaces the previous provider, ArbiterSports.

You must register on the RefQuest website and submit your officiating resume if you would like to apply to work any of the eight NCAA Championship meets (Division 1, 2, or 3).

Recently, the NCAA added a track and field resume form to the RQ+ website. Login to your RQ account and select RQ Forms on the top right of the page. Your resume form must be submitted by September 30, 2022.

If you do not have an RQ+ account, <u>follow this link to register</u>. Click "Register" in the upper right corner. The registration closes **September 30, 2022.** <u>Follow this link</u> to view the host locations for the D-1, D-2, and D-3 Championships for Cross Country, Indoor, and Outdoor Championships.

RefQuest (RQ+) is the new company chosen by the NCAA to provide online registration, education, assigning, and payment services to officials for selected NCAA championship events across several sports, including track and field.

The RQ+ platform allows USATF Officials to apply to officiate NCAA indoor and outdoor championship meets in 2022-2023. Registering also provides officials a method to be paid using direct deposit. Final selections for the eight championship events will be announced in mid to late December.



USATF Officials Committee Applications are available now to officiate the 2023 USATF Indoor, U20 Outdoor, and Senior Outdoor meets. <u>GO HERE</u> to submit your application. **The deadline to submit applications is October 15**.

To be considered for selection to one or more of these meets, you must be a National or Master level Certified Official in good standing in your USATF Association, and

three-step compliant with USATF <u>Safe Sport</u>. However, all Certified Officials, regardless of certification level, are encouraged to apply.

Please note: Even though the location and dates of some meets may be unknown at the time of application, we strongly encourage all interested officials to apply, even if you need to decline your selection later. We would much rather you have the opportunity to be selected than to regret not applying when the meet dates and location are announced.

Here is why applying is important:

If you are an official at ANY level, and have an interest in officiating the Youth Indoor or Outdoor National Championships, the Masters Indoor or Outdoor Championships, or the National Junior Olympic Championships, the NOC really needs you to submit an application so we can 1) pass your information along to the respective officials coordinators and 2) be sure you are included in the NOC database for evaluations.

If you are selected and work any of these meets, you receive an evaluation of your performance that provides the Selection Committee a snapshot of your work, experience, and level of achievement. This allows the committee to conduct a more thorough evaluation of your application.

How does my evaluation help me if I am only an Apprentice or Association level official?

Evaluations help you in two ways: 1) When you do apply for one of the big 3 meets, you will have a record of performance that the Selection Committee can review. By beginning to build that record now, you could have several evaluations to be considered (the committee retains evaluations for three years). 2) You get informed and important feedback about how you have performed that helps guide your future training and learning. This allows you to grow and get better, and you work on increasing and improving your technical skills.

Remember, you must be three-step Safe Sport compliant with USATF, and your Safe Sport compliance should be valid until the day after the last day of the meet that you want to work. So, if the last day of the meet is June 10, your compliance must still be valid on June 11.

Selections will be made by the Officials Selection Committee and announced in December during the USATF Annual Meeting.

Major Meet Applications Accepted September 15

The selection application window for the 2023 USATF Indoor, U20 Outdoor, and Senior Outdoor meets opens at 3 a.m. Eastern and midnight Pacific on September 15. **The deadline to submit applications is October 15.** All Certified Officials, regardless of certification level, are encouraged to submit an application and here is why:

To be considered for selection to one or more of these "big 3" meets, you must be a National or Master level Certified Official in good standing in your USATF Association, and three-step compliant with USATF Safe Sport.

If you are an official at ANY level, and have an interest in officiating the Youth Indoor or Outdoor National Championships, the Masters Indoor or Outdoor Championships, or the National Junior Olympic Championships, the NOC really needs you to submit an application so we can 1) pass your information along to the respective officials coordinators and 2) be sure you are included in the NOC database for evaluations.

Important Information About USATF Officials Grants


The National Officials Committee (NOC) recognizes the financial commitment faced by younger officials to travel to USATF National Championship meets. The NOC also recognizes the need to develop a larger pool of trained and experienced Implement Inspectors and Technical Managers. The NOC has established three grant programs to assist these officials:

- 1. Young Officials Grant
- 2. Implement Inspectors Grant
- 3. Technical Managers Grant

The deadline to submit applications for these grants is **December 15, 2022**. The grant recipients will be selected by the NOC Executive Committee from the pool of qualified applicants who meet the established criteria. Each grant recipient will be given \$500.

BE VIGILANT ON MAINTAINING YOUR 3-WAY COMPLIANCE

The recertification process for 2022 is near complete. Badges have been mailed out. If you have not gotten your badge or if there are omissions or errors on your badge, please send Ajay an email certification@pacific.usatf.org

Until late 2024 and early 2025, when we go through the recertification process again, you only need to maintain "3-way" compliance to keep your certification current

- No rules reviews unless you are upgrading or the credential change requires it. 3-way compliant means the following:
- 1. USATF membership has not expired (For about 110 of you the membership expires in 10 days, please renew now!)
- 2. Safesport training has not expired (This applies to 12 of you, please correct ASAP, for 10 more of you, the training expires in 10 more days, please take urgent action)
- 3. NCSI background check has not expired (For 2 of you the background check expires in the next 10 days, if you have not already done so, please take urgent action)

These are all done through your USATF connect sport80 portal now, so remember your login and update your password if needed. If you run into any issues with the login or membership renewal, send an email to Jamero Rainey jamrainey21@gmail.com at the USATF national office.

If you run into any issues with Safesport or NCSI background check, send an email to Lexie Ping (<u>safesport@usatf.org</u>) of the USATF national office. Copy me on such emails so that I can help, if needed.

DO NOT LET YOUR CERTIFICIATION CREDENTIALS LAPSE!

(This is what happened when officials were vetted for the Junior Olympics!)

The USATF national office sends reminders about a month before the expiration date. Please look for it and take immediate action. Also, you may want to make a note for your own self of the expiration date so you don't let your credentials lapse. USATF will send out emails to those who have lapsed one or more of those 3 requirements or are about to.

SAFESPORT

USATF in cooperation with the Center for Safesport Training will notify you of your pending Safesport training update Typically, you will have this notice sent to you within 30 days of expiration. PLEASE RENEW AND UPDATE your training ASAP in order to for your Officials Certification to remain 3 ways compliant. An example of this notice is as follows:

You are receiving this notice because your Refresher 1 SafeSport training is due to expire. You are due to renew this training by completing the Refresher 2 course ("Preventing Misconduct"). Please follow the below instructions to complete this training:

- 1. Log on to USATF Connect (please note: if you have more than one account associated with your name, choose your personal account).
- 2. Click "View" on your profile card under "Members".
- 3. Access the Center for SafeSport Training tab from the menu to the left.
- 4. Click the blue "Add Center for SafeSport Training" button in the upper right-hand corner of the page.
- 5. Find the Refresher 2 course ("Preventing Misconduct") from the list of available trainings. Add it to your account by clicking the blue "Add" button next to this training.

- 6. A new window will appear. Click "Add" for this training one last time.
- 7. A final window will appear. Click "Start Training" in the middle of this window to begin your course.

This training should take you 20-30 minutes to complete. Once you complete the training, your USATF Connect account will be updated to reflect your new training date. Please note that if you do not complete the required SafeSport training on or before the expiration date, you will not be considered USATF 3-Step SafeSport Compliant and you will no longer be eligible to serve in a role that requires SafeSport training (coach, official, volunteer, among others).


Code of Ethics and Performance Guidelines

New High School Rules Adopted

The National Federation of State High School Associations (NFHS) has approved eight rule changes for the 2023 high school track and field and cross country seasons.

Two key changes were made to Rule 3-4-3, defining specific case book guidelines, and the introduction of Rule 9, which creates a new indoor track and field rules section.

The rules committee's changes to Rule 3-4-3 defined specific case book guidelines to offer consistency and guidance to meet referees when ruling on reruns. New to the rule are scenarios to assist referees in determining when a rerun is necessary and stipulations that must apply for a rerun to be considered.

Due to recent changes to outdoor track and field rules and the growth of high school indoor track and field across the country, the NFHS Rules Committee felt it was necessary to create a section specifically for indoor track and field rules.

Best Practices for High School Disability (Para) Track and Field

Across the USA, more high schools are providing opportunities for disability (para) athletes to participate in track and field. The United States Paralympic Committee has a nine-page "GUIDELINES – BEST PRACTICES for DISABILITY TRACK and FIELD" document you can read and download it here.

Unless state high school associations have rules that are different, World Para Athletics Rules ultimately apply to any para-athlete 14 years of age or older on December 31 of the year of their competition. Any athlete 13 years of age or younger uses Adaptive Track & Field USA (ATFUSA) Rules for para track and field competition.

The guidelines address many of the questions about who is eligible to compete, what events are available for competition, advancement to state meets, and many other topics of concern.

Any high school official that may be working with para-athletes should download, read, and keep the guidelines document mentioned above as a reference for officiating para track and field at the high school level.

A quick reference comparison supplement of the rule changes and difference is annually compiled by Jim Hanley of the Southern Cal Assn.
