- Discussion of the potential Richmond facility as a strategic plan item that could serve multiple sports and age groups including track, field, cross-country, and MUT races, with John M. noting it would be similar to successful indoor facilities like Dempsey in Seattle with Mondo expressing willingness to design a custom track for the space.
- Dr. Sander presents the 2026 budget proposal which includes modifications for four indoor meets generating \$85,000 in revenue and expenses.
 - o The board **approves** the overall budget as presented with one abstention(21-0-1)
 - o The board votes to defer youth event budget decisions until November due to ongoing uncertainties about venue locations and participation numbers affected by scheduling conflicts.

USATF Masters 5K Cross Country National Championship (November 1st)

- Hosted at Golden Gate Park with excellent weather
- Strong participation: 100+ women finishers, 215 men finishers (compared to 60/80 in Boulder previous year)
- Pacific Association teams earned numerous medals and team championships
- Financially broke even (slight profit), which is unusual for such events
- National office was highly impressed with the event management

Financial Report

- Total assets exceeded \$1 million (\$1,013,800)
- Investment account: \$1,007,000
- Membership revenue down (currently \$65,000 vs. projected \$97,000)
- Investment gains of approximately \$85,000 offsetting membership shortfalls

Other Updates

- Foundation provided JO Travel Grants with successful recipients
- Super Clinic scheduled for January 26th at Jessup University in Rocklin
- Membership declined: PA from 7,800 to 7,500;
- NCAA Regional Cross Country at Hagen Oaks successfully completed (264 women, 208 men)
- CIM designated as National Marathon Championship for 2024-2025
- Level 1 coaching scholarship of \$100 approved for youth coaches completing certification in 2025
- Youth Cross Country Championship concerns raised regarding qualification changes affecting 100+ athletes
