- March Meeting Minutes–Approved
- Treasurer’s Report–Approved
 - Investments: Merrill Lynch holdings performing well despite market volatility; 10-year strategy remains solid
 - Foundation transfer: \$250,000 transfer to foundation pending; awaiting new treasurer appointment
 - Membership tracking: On target; Junior Olympics may increase numbers as athletes qualify
 - Indoor meets financials: Breaking even as planned (~\$17,000-18,000/day venue cost); 80% entries from high school demographic
 - Revenue strategy: Goal is membership growth rather than profit; successfully adding high school members
- Bylaw Review Committee Update
 - Committee members: Cris Houston, JR Heberle, Don Collins, Dave Shrock, Jackie Callender (National Accreditation)
 - Scope: Updates ensure compliance with USATF Regulation 7; first year bylaws reviewed as part of accreditation process
 - Major changes: Most substantive revisions in grievance and dispute resolution sections; election process unchanged due to National regulations requiring 30-day balloting
 - Review needed: Housekeeping and renumbering work ongoing; committee requests feedback via email to any committee member
 - Operating procedures: Separate document update planned after bylaw completion; committee chairs should review current procedures
- Pacific Association Foundation
 - Board changes: Michelle La Sala (treasurer, Napa/Big Sur Marathon director) and others departing; seeking new treasurer
 - George Kleeman grants: Spring track & field grants for open athletes launched on social media
 - Junior Olympics grants: Requirements established; awards in July but distributed after meet in September

- Marathon grants: Planned for fall cycle; 10 awards anticipated
- Grant history: 10 Junior Olympics grants awarded in 2025
- Upcoming Championship Competition Events
 - NCAA
 - D1 XC Championships: November 13, 2026 (Friday) at Haggin Oaks, Sacramento
 - D2 XC Championships: November 21, 2026 (Saturday) at Haggin Oaks
 - Management: New team assembled (SRA unavailable due to CIM National Championship two weeks after D2s); Brendan involved but getting break from full management
 - Parking contingency: If wet conditions, busing from American River College as in past two years
 - NCAA Indoor Track: Conversations in Arkansas about national championship, likely 2028-29; would attract ACC (Stanford/Cal), Big Ten (UCLA/USC/Oregon/Washington) conference meets to Reno track
 - Other XC meets:
 - Section cross country November 14
 - Pacific Association championship November 15 at Golden Gate Park
 - MUT Series
 - Discussion to be continued in September 2026 due to unavailability of potential meet production staff
 - 2028 JO Cross Country Bid: Working with Tri-Valley Tourism on bid for Dublin area at Los Positas Golf Course;
 - event never held in California in 45 years despite state having 10,000 youth members
 - Backup venue: Reno Golf Course (hosted Mountain West Regional) interested if Tri-Valley doesn't materialize
- 2026 Junior Olympic Championship meets
 - Primary meet: June 26-28 (Friday-Sunday) at Monterey Peninsula College
 - Long throws venue: Hartnell College (Salinas) hosting hammer and javelin (~20-25 minutes from MPC); javelin Friday, hammer Sunday
 - Facility costs: MPC secured at \$5,700 for three days; Hartnell paperwork in progress
 - Officials stipend: Seeking donations to fund \$100/day stipend; \$1,500 already committed
 - Venue features: MPC has 3,000-seat stadium, covered athlete areas (no tent purchase needed), ample parking; Hartnell has excellent javelin runway
 - Tourism support: "See Monterey" actively assisting with website, hotel blocks, and promotion
 - Meet information: Flyers and athletic.net shell to be posted this week
 - Combined events: July 11-12 at James Logan High School

- 2026 USATF Annual Meeting
 - Dates: December 3-6, 2026 (Thursday-Sunday)
 - Location: Portland, Oregon (likely Hilton and sister hotel; Nike expected to have major role)
 - Delegation: Committee representatives needed by September; youth representation especially important
 - Region 14 status: Pacific fighting to remain independent region due to size; combination with other regions would create confusion

 - Officials lost: Five officials passed away in 2026 (highest number since current officials chair tenure)
 - Recent losses: Chuck Buettner (celebration of life held May 18), Dickie Iwamiya (June 20 at Buddhist temple in Lodi), Bob Rush (June 6 in Redwood City)
